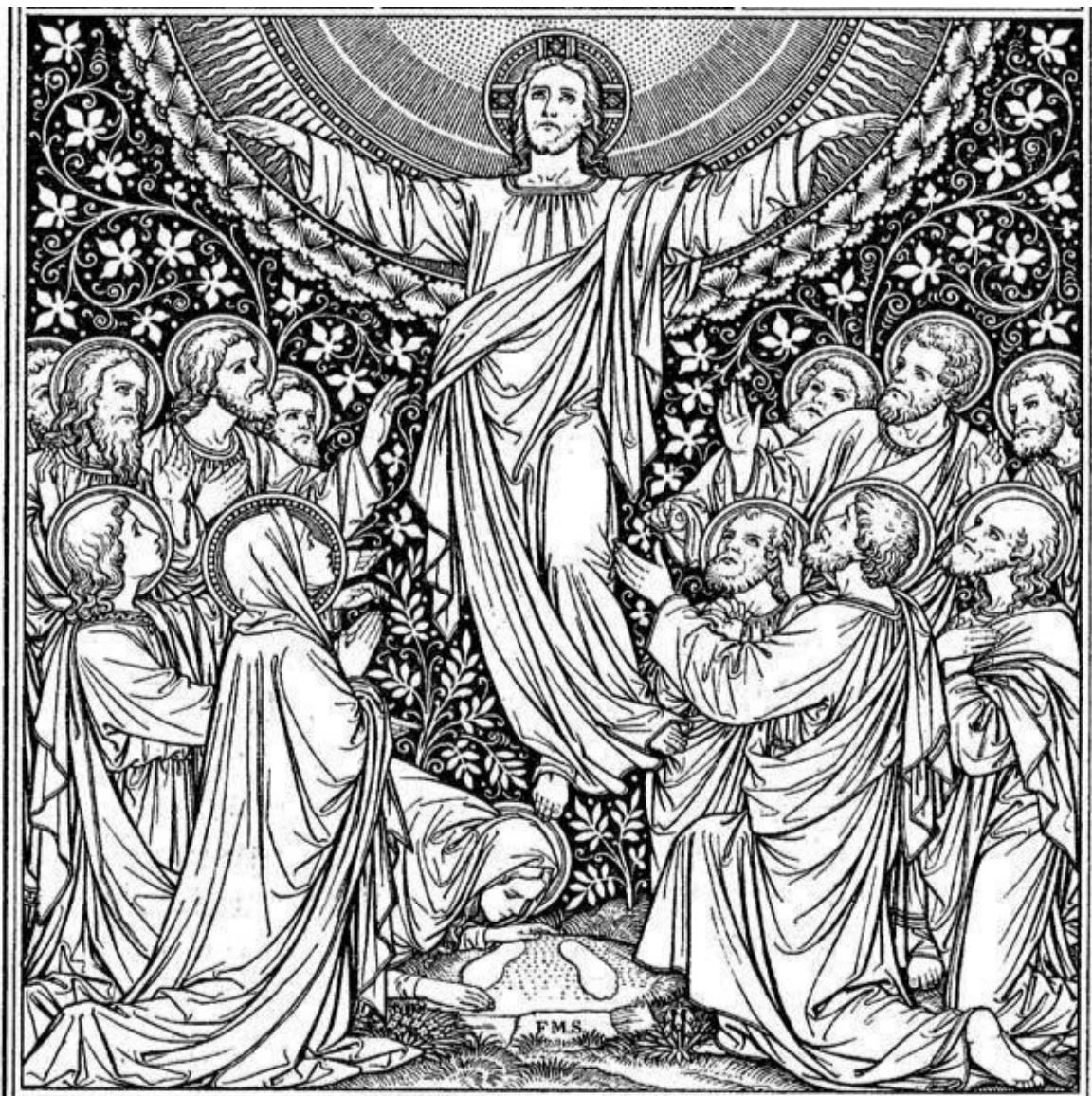

## THE GATHERING OF GOD'S PEOPLE

### **The Service of Preparation for Membership of The Order of the Daughters of the King**

*Presenter:* It is my privilege to present these persons as candidates for membership in The Order of the Daughters of the King.

*Celebrant:* Dear friends in Christ: You have expressed an interest in becoming a member of The Order of the Daughters of the King. You are asked to serve a twelve-week preparation period during which you will learn about and follow the two Rules of The Order: The Rule of Prayer and The Rule of Service. In addition, you are asked to learn about The Order, including its Prayer and Motto, and participate in twelve sessions using the National Study Guide, which will help you grow in your knowledge and love of God as you pray and serve him daily.

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

*The Lord speaks to us in scripture and preaching about how He has saved all humankind from the power of death by raising His Son to life again. We respond proclaiming our belief, praying for the world, and greeting one another in His Name.*

### First Lesson

Acts 1:6-14

*Reader* A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the apostles had come together, they asked Jesus, “Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?” He replied, “It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight.

While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.”

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day’s journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.

## Second Lesson

1 Peter 4:12-14; 5:6-11

*Reader* A reading from the First Epistle of St. Peter.

Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that is taking place among you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice insofar as you are sharing Christ's sufferings, so that you may also be glad and shout for joy when his glory is revealed. If you are reviled for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory, which is the Spirit of God, is resting on you.

Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, so that he may exalt you in due time. Cast all your anxiety on him, because he cares for you. Discipline yourselves, keep alert. Like a roaring lion your adversary the devil prowls around, looking for someone to devour. Resist him, steadfast in

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. 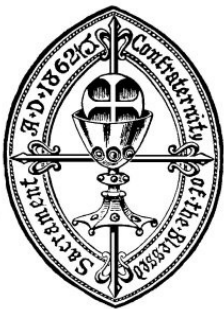

### **Join us in our parish activities**

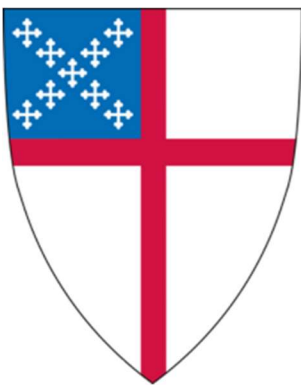

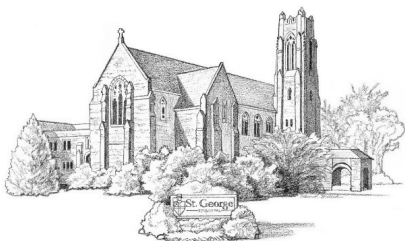

# MINISTRY WITH CHILDREN AND YOUTH

## NURSERY CARE

Nursery care is available each Sunday during the 10 a.m. service, September to June, for our youngest members and visitors. The nursery is located in The Children's Ark and staffed by certified childcare providers.

## GODLY PLAY SUNDAY SCHOOL PROGRAM

Our Godly Play Sunday School meets most Sundays at 10 a.m. from September to May. Godly Play is widely recognized as a premier Sunday School curriculum, where children learn about the love of God for them through the stories of the Holy Bible. Old Testament and New Testament stories alike come alive as students discuss, question, and wonder aloud at God's ongoing relationship with his creation.

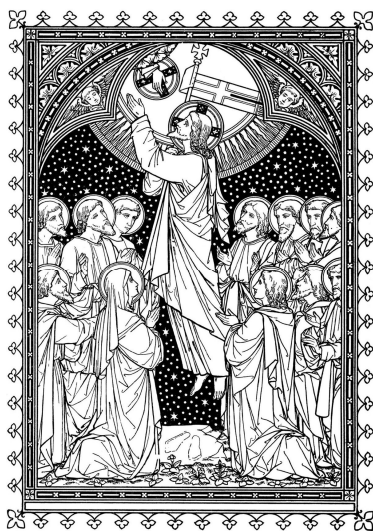

## **Ascension Day (transferred)** Holy Eucharist and brown bag lunch

On **Thursday May 21 at 1:00 p.m.**, we will celebrate a brief service of Holy Eucharist in the Lady Chapel. Afterwards, all who desire may gather in the kitchen for a brown bag lunch.

Ascension Day is one of the seven principal feast days of the Church. Recorded in the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, Jesus' bodily ascension is our promise that every part of our humanity – body, soul, and spirit – will be part of the redeemed creation and live with God forever.

## Community Announcements

**Music Notes:** Peter Philips is composer of today's Communion Motet. He was born in London approximately 1560 and grew up as a chorister in St. Paul's Cathedral Choir. He eventually settled in the Spanish Netherlands. His music was widely published in his lifetime and appreciated by William Byrd and Tomas Louis Victoria. The text of this morning's Offertory Anthem comes from the Ascensiontide liturgy, often used as an Offertory or motet, drawing from Psalm 47 and Psalm 103. Philips uses "word painting" to reflect the text, with upward-moving melodic lines for *ascendit* (he has ascended) and rhythmic, fanfare-like passages to mimic *in voce tubae* (with the sound of the trumpet).
