THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The Lord speaks to us in scripture and preaching about the power of the Holy Spirit.

We respond proclaiming our belief, praying for the world, and greeting one another in His Name.

First Lesson

Acts 2:1-21

Reader A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs -- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'"

Second Lesson

1 Corinthians 12:3b-13

Reader A reading from the First Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians.

No one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body -- Jews or Greeks, slaves or free -- and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

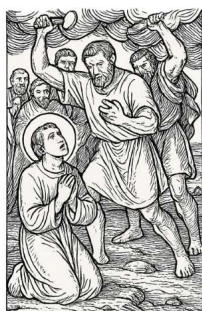

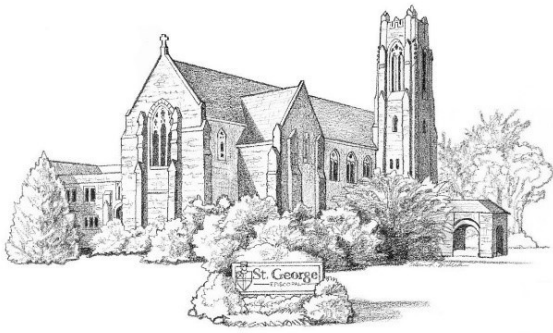
THE GUILD OF SAINT SEBASTIAN

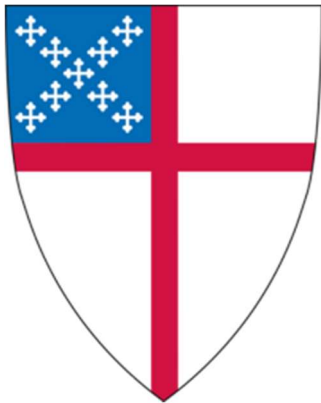

The Buildings and Grounds committee of the Vestry has organized a clean-up / clean-out day with the support of our Boy Scout Troop 300. We are targeting the less glamorous basement areas of the church. There are a lot of old building materials, stored equipment, and STUFF that is no longer used and is generally orphaned.



A 40-yard dumpster is being dropped off Friday afternoon May 29th to collect and dispose of the materials. It is being picked up on Monday morning June 1.

The sanctuary candle this Sunday is offered to the glory of God and in loving memory of Alison Hadden by her sister and parents.

Music Notes: The anthem “O Holy Spirit, Lord of Grace” by Christopher Tye (c. 1505–1573) is a staple of the English choral tradition, typically sung during Pentecost. Interestingly, the music and words were paired long after Tye’s death: while he composed the music in the 16th century, the English text is a 19th-century translation by John Chandler of a 1736 Latin hymn by Charles Coffin. The music itself is light, joyous, and articulate, and the text fits it so naturally that one could easily imagine Tye had the words in mind from the beginning.
