Ezekiel 33:7-11

Reader A reading from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel.

You, son of man, I have made a sentinel for the house of Israel; whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me. If I say to the wicked, "O wicked ones, you shall surely die," and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but their blood I will require at your hand. But if you warn the wicked to turn from their ways, and they do not turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but you will have saved your life.

Now you, son of man, say to the house of Israel, Thus you have said: "Our transgressions and our sins weigh upon us, and we waste away because of them; how then can we live?" Second Lesson

Romans 13:8-14

Reader A reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Romans.

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, “You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet”; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, “Love your neighbor as yourself.” Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

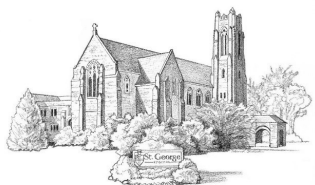

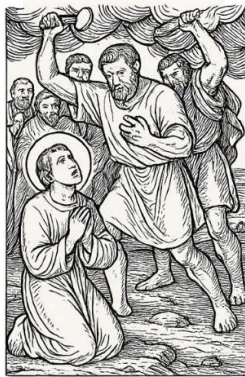

THE CORPS OF ACOLYTES

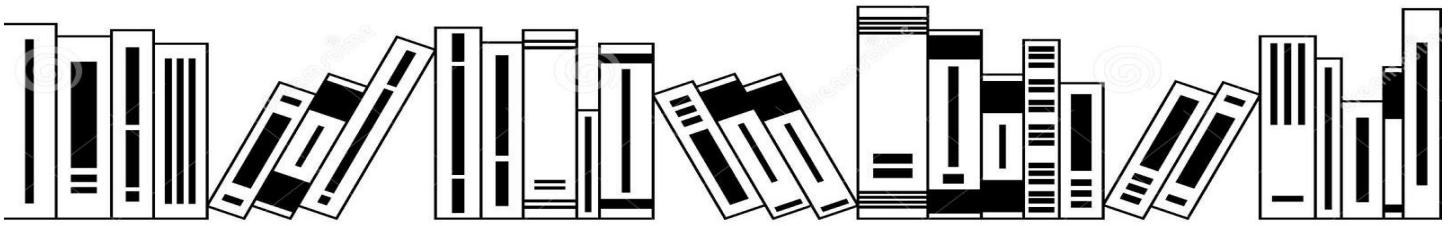

Diocesan Convention delegates needed

The 243rd Convention of the Diocese of Pennsylvania will be held on Saturday, October 10, beginning at 9 a.m. Convention makes decisions about diocesan canons, resolutions, new ministries, and the diocesan budget, which is funded in part by assessments from parishes, including St. George's.

An important part of Anglicanism is that lay people share in the governance of the Church. Each parish therefore sends lay representatives to Convention. St. George's is allotted two delegates, and proposals must receive a majority of both lay and clergy votes to pass.
